The main engine could not be run and a tow was organised from Brisbane.

The vessel berthed successfully with the use of one tug and its anchors.
24/07/11	MA201100060	16:32	UTC+10	No	Dampier, Western Australia	Maersk Supporter	IMO No	9169471	Fire/explosion	On 24 July 2011, the platform support vessel Maersk Supporter was involved in a tow off Dampier, WA, when a fire started on its number two main engine. The fire was extinguished and power restored from the three remaining main engines.

Section 48 of the Act contains a definition for an OBR. The voice component of a Voyage Data Recorder normally meets the requirements of an OBR.

Part 6 Division 1 of the TSI Act provides for certain confidentiality protections which must be applied to OBRs. Where an OBR is declared not to be an OBR other protections may continue to apply such as those relating to personal information under privacy legislation.
