A leak was suspected based on water ingress into the vessel's hydraulic fluid system. Water ingress was evident during extreme weather. There have been no positive indicators of actual leak based on an oil sheen. Since 25th June divers were used to inspect the suspected leak area on two occasions but have not locate or confirm a leak. Water has been periodically drained from the system and additional oil added. The volume of the leak is based on the volume of oil added.
03/07/2013	MA201300057	10:50	UTC+9.5	Yes - MO-2013-007	Whyalla, South Australia	Atlantic Princess	IMO No	9296200	Fatality	At about 1050 on 3 July 2013, a ship's representative was transferring from a launch to the bulk carrier Atlantic Princess, which was at anchor off Whyalla South Australia, when he fell from the ship's combination ladder. He landed on the deck of the launch and was seriously injured. He was taken ashore and admitted to hospital, but died later that day.

Note: For the purpose of subsection 49(2) of the Transport Safety Investigation Act 2003 (TSI Act) any On-Board Recordings (OBR) relating to a matter that the ATSB has decided not to investigate, as identified in this publication, are not to be treated as OBR on and after the date of publication of this weekly summary.

Section 48 of the TSI Act contains a definition of an OBR. The voice component of a Voyage Data Recorder normally meets the requirements of an OBR.

Part 6 Division 1 of the TSI Act provides for certain confidentiality protections which must be applied to OBR. When an OBR is declared not to be an OBR other protections may continue to apply such as those relating to personal information under privacy legislation.
