The ship proceeded to the closest contingency anchorage and the leak was repaired. The main engine was subsequently tested without fault.
31/12/2013	MA201300149	0:01	UTC+8	No	East Lewis, Dampier	Westsea 7	Official number	858211	Grounding / stranding	The barge Westsea 7 was moored off West Lewis Island, Dampier when it broke its moorings during tropical cyclone 'Christine' and ran aground on the island.
31/12/2013	MA201300150	0:01	UTC+8	No	West Lewis Island, Dampier	Fitzroy Star	IMO No	9216860	Grounding / stranding	On 31 December 2013, after tropical cyclone 'Christine' had crossed the coastline, the tug was noticed to have drifted away from its mooring position. Inspection showed it to have run aground on East Lewis Island. Subsequent inspection revealed hull damage but the vessel remained watertight.

Note: For the purpose of subsection 49(2) of the Transport Safety Investigation Act 2003 (TSI Act) any On-Board Recordings (OBR) relating to a matter that the ATSB has decided not to investigate, as identified in this publication, are not to be treated as OBR on and after the date of publication of this weekly summary.

Section 48 of the TSI Act contains a definition of an OBR. The voice component of a Voyage Data Recorder normally meets the requirements of an OBR.

Part 6 Division 1 of the TSI Act provides for certain confidentiality protections which must be applied to OBR. When an OBR is declared not to be an OBR other protections may continue to apply such as those relating to personal information under privacy legislation.
