The fire was extinguished but the master's bedroom was extensively damaged. No important ship's systems or equipment were damaged and the ship proceeded on its voyage toward Newcastle. No injuries were reported.
20/01/2014	MA201400003	15:00	UTC+8	No	Cockatoo Island anchorage	Spiliani	IMO No	9070773	Equipment failure	During a routine AMSA inspection of the ship and testing of the emergency generator one of the starting batteries failed and leaked during the test. The test was stopped. No other damage or injuries were reported.

Note: For the purpose of subsection 49(2) of the Transport Safety Investigation Act 2003 (TSI Act) any On-Board Recordings (OBR) relating to a matter that the ATSB has decided not to investigate, as identified in this publication, are not to be treated as OBR on and after the date of publication of this weekly summary.

Section 48 of the TSI Act contains a definition of an OBR. The voice component of a Voyage Data Recorder normally meets the requirements of an OBR.

Part 6 Division 1 of the TSI Act provides for certain confidentiality protections which must be applied to OBR. When an OBR is declared not to be an OBR other protections may continue to apply such as those relating to personal information under privacy legislation.
