08/02/2013	MA201300010	13:45	UTC+11	Yes - MO-2013-003	Sydney	Calliope	IMO No	1010416	Fatality	On the afternoon of 8 February 2013, the 42 m Cayman Islands registered motor yacht Calliope departed from the Sydney Superyacht Marina in Rozelle Bay for a cruise around the harbour. As Calliope transited the Glebe Island Bridge, it was off course and veered towards the bridge structure. To minimise any damage to the vessel, the crew attempted to walk a fender between the yacht's hull and any possible points of contact. During this process, a crew member, leaning over the side of the yacht positioning the fender, was caught between the yacht and one of the bridge mounted fenders. The crew member was pulled over the yacht's side and into the water. The crew member was retrieved from the water shortly afterwards but died as a result of the injuries he had sustained.
01/03/2014	MA201400026	0:01	UTC+8	No	Wyndham, Western Australia	Arietta	IMO No	9446403	Grounding / stranding	Ship swung on an ebb tide with 2 anchors brought up, dragged 200m and grounded. The vessel was refloated a short time later with minimal damage.

Section 48 of the TSI Act contains a definition of an OBR. The voice component of a Voyage Data Recorder normally meets the requirements of an OBR.

Part 6 Division 1 of the TSI Act provides for certain confidentiality protections which must be applied to OBR. When an OBR is declared not to be an OBR other protections may continue to apply such as those relating to personal information under privacy legislation.
