An engineer was holding the IHWGC (about 360 kg) in a vertical position when it toppled over over trapping him by his leftleg. He sustained serious injuries and was treated by the onboard doctor prior to being airlift to Darwin.

16/02/2015	MA201500021	23:45	UTC+10	No	Fisherman Islands Berth 10	CMA CGM Puget	IMO No	9248124	Damage to ship or equipment	A 40 foot container was being lifted from the ship when it dropped, about 8m, and landed partially across another container and on the hatch lid. The hatch lid was holed by a corner of the container. No injuries or other damage was sustained.

Note: For the purpose of subsection 49(2) of the Transport Safety Investigation Act 2003 (TSI Act) any On-Board Recordings (OBR) relating to a matter that the ATSB has decided not to investigate, as identified in this publication, are not to be treated as OBR on and after the date of publication of this weekly summary.

Section 48 of the TSI Act contains a definition of an OBR. The voice component of a Voyage Data Recorder normally meets the requirements of an OBR.

Part 6 Division 1 of the TSI Act provides for certain confidentiality protections which must be applied to OBR. When an OBR is declared not to be an OBR other protections may continue to apply such as those relating to personal information under privacy legislation.
