Despite the effort to use the tug to correct, the bow landed on one fender resulting in severe damage to the fender. There was no damage to the wharf itself or the vessel.
11/05/2015	MA201500068	17:48	UTC+8	No	Port Hedland	Maritime Coaction	IMO No	9515670	Machinery failure	During entry into Port Hedland the ship's main engine shutdown unexpectedly. The pilotage was aborted. The fault was rectified and about 10 minutes later the pilotage was resumed and the ship entered port without further incident.
12/05/2015	MA201500069	21:45	UTC+9.5	No	Adelaide container terminal, No 6 berth	OOCL Norfolk	IMO No	9440045	Equipment failure	Strong winds (to 35 knots) resulted in a wharf bollard failing and the ship moving off the wharf. Cargo was stopped, the main engine and bow thruster readied and port control notified. The ship was brought back alongside and additional mooring lines run. About 2 hours later conditions were suitable and cargo operations resumed.

Note: For the purpose of subsection 49(2) of the Transport Safety Investigation Act 2003 (TSI Act) any On-Board Recordings (OBR) relating to a matter that the ATSB has decided not to investigate, as identified in this publication, are not to be treated as OBR on and after the date of publication of this weekly summary.

Section 48 of the TSI Act contains a definition of an OBR. The voice component of a Voyage Data Recorder normally meets the requirements of an OBR.

Part 6 Division 1 of the TSI Act provides for certain confidentiality protections which must be applied to OBR. When an OBR is declared not to be an OBR other protections may continue to apply such as those relating to personal information under privacy legislation.
