The fault was determined to be inadvertent operation of the engine room manual shut down switch for the crosshead lube oil pump. The fault was rectified and passage resumed after a 20 minute delay.
24/09/2015	MA201500133	12:00	UTC+10	No	Goods Island, Torres Strait	Ocean Ute	IMO No	9074925		As the ship approached the pilot boarding ground to the west of Goods Island, all rudder angle indication on the bridge was lost. The steering gear was checked and verified operational. Reef VTS and the pilot were notified and consulted. The decision was made to proceed with the pilotage and continue to the next port with the steering gear room continuously attended to verify and relay rudder angles to the bridge.

Section 48 of the TSI Act contains a definition of an OBR. The voice component of a Voyage Data Recorder normally meets the requirements of an OBR.

Part 6 Division 1 of the TSI Act provides for certain confidentiality protections which must be applied to OBR. When an OBR is declared not to be an OBR other protections may continue to apply such as those relating to personal information under privacy legislation.
