The fire alarm was sounded and on board fire response initiated. After about 15 minutes the fire was confirmed to be extinguished and all crew and shore workers accounted for. No injuries were reported.
13/10/2016	MA201600081	19:50	UTC+10	No	Brisbane pilotage	Stadacona	IMO No	8010934	Equipment failure	During departure from Brisbane under pilot guidance, the rudder failed to respond to a helm order. The steering control was changed to the standby system and rudder response returned. The pilotage proceeded and the ship departed without further incident. The fault was subsequently traced to a burnt out solenoid coil.

Note: For the purpose of subsection 49(2) of the Transport Safety Investigation Act 2003 (TSI Act) any On-Board Recordings (OBR) relating to a matter that the ATSB has decided not to investigate, as identified in this publication, are not to be treated as OBR on and after the date of publication of this weekly summary.

Section 48 of the TSI Act contains a definition of an OBR. The voice component of a Voyage Data Recorder normally meets the requirements of an OBR.

Part 6 Division 1 of the TSI Act provides for certain confidentiality protections which must be applied to OBR. When an OBR is declared not to be an OBR other protections may continue to apply such as those relating to personal information under privacy legislation.
