The pilot instructed the tugs to increase power and the crew applied power to the bow thrusters but the vessel's momentum could not be arrested. The cargo vessel's port quarter collided with the side of the container ship resulting in minor damage to both vessels.

Section 48 of the TSI Act contains a definition of an OBR. The voice component of a Voyage Data Recorder normally meets the requirements of an OBR.

Part 6 Division 1 of the TSI Act provides for certain confidentiality protections which must be applied to OBR. When an OBR is declared not to be an OBR other protections may continue to apply such as those relating to personal information under privacy legislation.
