Attempts to extinguish the fire were unsuccessful and the crew and passengers used a tender to abandon the charter vessel prior to it sinking. The tender was subsequently swamped by a wave and capsized and all occupants were later retrieved from the water by a helicopter and a rescue vessel.

A search was unable to locate the missing boat or crew member.

Note: For the purpose of subsection 49(2) of the Transport Safety Investigation Act 2003 (TSI Act) any On-Board Recordings (OBR) relating to a matter that the ATSB has decided not to investigate, as identified in this publication, are not to be treated as OBR on and after the date of publication of this weekly summary.

Section 48 of the TSI Act contains a definition of an OBR. The voice component of a Voyage Data Recorder normally meets the requirements of an OBR.

Part 6 Division 1 of the TSI Act provides for certain confidentiality protections which must be applied to OBR. When an OBR is declared not to be an OBR other protections may continue to apply such as those relating to personal information under privacy legislation.
