Circumstances:

During circuit training, the aircraft suffered a complete engine failure. The pilot was unable to reach the flight strip and landed the aircraft amongst trees. One of the two pistons of the two stoke engine had seized in the cylinder, probably due to lack of lubrication.

Significant Factors:

It was considered that the following factors were relevant to the development of the accident:

- 1. Engine failed in flight (piston seized).
- 2. Piston seized (probably) through lack of lubrication.
- 3. Aircraft may have been refuelled from a drum containing raw fuel (no lubricating two-stroke oil mixed in with it).
- 4. Forced landing on unsuitable terrain.
