## **Circumstances:**

The pilot had been operating in support of mustering operations, and had landed a number of times to liaise with the mustering party. The pilot advised that he refuelled to full tanks from a drum that morning but he was confused as to the fuel capacity of the aircraft as the figure "98 litres" was written near each tank cap. During the return to the mustering yard the engine failed, and power could only be restored momentarily before a forced landing was necessary. The aircraft touched down in scrubland, collided with a stump and subsequently overturned. Discussions with the pilot revealed that he had not kept an accurate check on his fuel useage and had over estimated the endurance.
